

Year 7 Literacy & Numeracy Catch up Premium 2018/19

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve [the expected standard](#) (scaled score of 100) in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2) <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/year-7-literacy-and-numeracy-catch-up-premium-guide-for-schools>

The use of the Y7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch Up Premium 2018/19	
<p>In September 2018 the school have identified 32 students who we consider would directly benefit from the use of the Catch-Up Premium. Other students will also benefit from the premium due to additional provision in some classes which will benefit the class a whole. The allocation for these pupils was £6,174.</p> <p>We are using the Year 7 Catch-Up Premium to provide catch up support in literacy and/or numeracy as appropriate for the individual pupils. All eligible pupils are receiving small group teaching to enable them to benefit from extra individual attention. Many of the lessons also have at least one learning support assistant in the class.</p>

Impact demonstrated on progress of students eligible for Catch-Up Premium	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ 40% of the students' reading ages increased by more than a chronological year in 6 months. ✓ English: 79% of students made Good or Excellent progress in their end of year summative assessment. This data was triangulated with teacher's assessment of class work. This progress was measured across students of a similar ability, not all of whom had not achieved the expected standard in year 6. ✓ Maths: 83% of students made Good or Excellent progress by the end of the academic year. This was assessed in a similar way to English.
