We are delighted to invite you to come and look around Theale Green School and on our journey to achieve the ALET Mission of “transforming lives through learning”. As we continue in our second academic year as part of ALET, we have made our mark within the Trust and placed Theale Green School firmly on the ALET map.

We want you to be certain that you have chosen the right school for you. Our staff team at TGS are loyal, confident, supportive, resilient and hugely determined; our determination is borne of a clear desire to ensure that TGS will become the best school that it can be, and we are highly focused on the pathway ahead to achieve our Mission. If this feels like a “family” that you would like to join, then we will be delighted to welcome you.

We have achieved a ‘massive improvement’ (DfE April 2019) in our first year and have done it by delivering what we set out to do. Our recent Year 7 intake has increased by 70% on the three previous years as the community recognises the very significant and substantial changes taking place. Staff absence and turnover are both low, and this is a strong reflection of our culture.

The role of Attendance Officer is crucial to our School, ensuring that all students on roll are able to access the best possible education experience during their time with us. This role focusses on removing barriers to learning; working with a wide range of external professionals, parents/carers, teaching and support staff as well as students, this role is demanding and very rewarding. We look forward to hearing from you if you are seeking work that is challenging and varied, can present you with new situations on a daily basis but where you also work with data and reports.

As Headteacher (I teach a Year 10 and a Year 11 Science class), I am passionate about the power of education to open doors for young people, and in this age of results driven outcomes often being seen as the primary measure of success for schools, Theale Green School equally has a rich and impressive heritage of the Creative Arts and Sport, which continues to grow from strength to strength in our curriculum. Talent comes in all shapes and sizes, and we firmly believe that whilst high grades are an important aspiration for all of our students, each individual student has much to offer Theale Green School in addition; every child at Theale Green School must feel valued for who they are, and building confidence and resilience is an important part of the ethos surrounding participation in life at school. Student leadership, membership of clubs, involvement in the community, participation in sports teams and performance events and the Duke of Edinburgh programme all provide important opportunities for personal development of our students.

We have recently invested in a refurbishment of many of our buildings, completely refurbishing our IT suites and upgrading our whole school network; our Sixth Form students value their modern and
