Introduction

Polar bears are internationally known as a vulnerable species by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN). The main concern for polar bears is habitat loss and less food because of climate change. Scientists predict that as the Arctic continues to warm, two-thirds of the world's polar bears could disappear within this century (source: Polar Bears International). However, it is also shown that if we as humans take action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions soon, maybe polar bears can survive.

My investigation into the link between climate change and the decline of polar bears

Polar bear facts and why they are dying

- Rapid loss of sea ice is the main threat to the polar bear's long-term survival.
- Polar bears are found in the frozen wilds of places like the Arctic, which means as the earth warms up due to climate change there is a risk their habitat disappears.
- Their huge size and weight make them the largest living carnivores (meat eaters) on Earth! Because they are so big, they need a lot of food and there is not enough food to go around so less polar bears can survive.
- These magnificent mammals have an incredible sense of smell which they use to track their food, seals. They can sniff out prey from up to 16km away! But they are having to travel further and further to find food so even with this sense of smell, they still need to travel further.
- Climate change is causing them to travel further to find food, so it's a good thing that Polar bears are excellent swimmers. They have been spotted in waters over 100km offshore!
- Polar bears aren't quick enough to catch seals in open water so they depend on the ice as a hunting platform. Because the ice is melting polar bears have less hunting platforms to catch the seals
- Sadly, these incredible creatures are classified as "vulnerable". The biggest threat to polar bears
 is climate change. Rising global temperatures means that sea ice is melting earlier and forming
 later each year, leaving polar bears less time to hunt for food.
- Other challenges include pollution, increased commercial use of the Arctic, overharvest, disease, and inadequate habitat protection (denning and seasonal resting areas).

Five ways to help polar bears


